Fall 2011

The undergraduate enrollment of 12,575 includes 156 students classified as Non-Degree or Postbaccalaureate. There are 3,033 first-time freshmen and 449 new transfer students. Fifty-eight percent of these undergraduates are females, and 34 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 34 percent of the group, while 15 percent are Non-Denominational and 16 percent are Catholics.

Ninety-six percent of these students are U.S. citizens, while 536 (4.3%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 71 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' home addresses, there are undergraduates from 49 states and the District of Columbia. Seventy-eight percent of the students are from Texas.

Among students with reported high school class ranking, 71 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of undergraduates is 1120 - 1300 with a mean score of 1212 for the SAT and 24 - 29 with a mean score of 26.2 for the ACT examination.

Fall 2010

The undergraduate enrollment of 12,438 includes 154 students classified as Non-Degree or Postbaccalaureate. There are 3,259 first-time freshmen and 417 new transfer students. Fifty-eight percent of these undergraduates are females, and almost 34 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 35 percent of the group, while 15 percent are Non-Denominational and 15 percent are Catholics.

Ninety-six percent of these students are U.S. citizens, while 531 (4.2%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 74 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' home addresses, there are undergraduates from 48 states and the District of Columbia. Eighty percent of the students are from Texas.

Among students with reported high school class ranking, 71 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of undergraduates is 1110 - 1300 with a mean score of 1207 for the SAT and 23 - 28 with a mean score of 25.9 for the ACT examination.

* In order to fulfill new federal government reporting requirements on race and ethnicity, students were given the opportunity to select multiple race categories. In addition, Pacific Islander was designated as its own category (separate from Asian). The students were asked two questions. The first question asked the student "Are you Hispanic/Latino?" The second question allowed students to select among five race categories, with multiple responses allowed.

In this report, two race/ethnic group tables are presented. In the first table, students are counted in only one race/ethnic group category. If the student indicated "yes" to the first question, the student was categorized as Hispanic (only) regardless of any race code(s) they may have selected. If the student marked more than one race (and "no" to Hispanic/Latino in the first question), he/she was reported in the category of Multiracial. The second table counts a student in every race/ethnic group category he/she selected. The percentages in this table are based on the headcount of students.
