## **Biology/Chemistry Prerequisite Policies:**

<u>Biology</u>: In order to register for BIO 1305 and 1306, students must have either a satisfactory math score on the ACT or SAT OR have completed MTH 1320 (Pre-Calculus) with a grade of B or better. <u>Chemistry:</u> In order to register for CHE 1301, students must have either a satisfactory math score on the ACT or SAT or have a minimum grade of B in CHE 1300 AND a minimum grade of B in either MTH 1320 (Pre-Calculus) or MTH 1321 (Calculus.
