- Because most of our majors go on to graduate school, we have recommended certain courses that will prepare students for this likely eventuality. Some of these courses are only offered during one semester: CLA 3301-Roman Civilization (spring); CLA 3302-Greek Civilization (fall); HIS 4322-Ancient Greece (fall); HIS 4324-Ancient Rome (spring).
- For major, complete 6 hours from: LAT 3000-4000; CLA 3000-4000; PHI 3310; GKC 3000-4000; PSC 3352; HIS 4322, 4324.
- Check your degree audit often through Bearweb to ensure that you are making timely progress toward your degree.
