Notes about major requirements:

– **Foreign Language:** Complete both of the following requirements:

A. Non-western language (Arabic, Chinese, Greek, Hebrew, Indonesian, Japanese, Korean, Russian, Swahili)

Complete one option from the following:

1. Complete one non-western language through 2320 OR
2. complete two non-western languages through 1302/1402 in each.

B. Complete an additional language through 2320 selected from: Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Greek, Hebrew, Indonesian, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Latin, Portuguese, Russian, Spanish, Swahili

– **Linguistics Elective Options:**

A. Twelve semester hours selected from: LING 3311, 3315, 3319, 4311, 4312, 4313, 4314, 4316, 4318, 4319, or 4V20

B. Three additional semester hours selected from any of the courses not counted above or selected from the following courses: LING 3312, CSD 2318, TED 4312, SPA/FRE/GER 4315, PHI 4345, 4353, PSY 3311.

– There is a minimum of twenty-seven hours of advanced work (3000-4000 level) in this major.

– All Linguistics majors and minors must take the four core courses: LING 3310, 4302, 4303, and 4305. These should be taken before the upper-level Linguistics electives.

– LING 3310 is the desired gateway course to the major or minor and should be taken in the spring of sophomore year, if possible. Prior to taking LING 3310 students must have completed at least one of ENG 2301 or 2304/2306 or their equivalent (BIC 1324).

– Due to scheduling limitations, many Linguistics courses are offered only one semester per year. Students need to plan ahead to avoid scheduling difficulties.

1. While LING 3310 is offered fall and spring; LING 4303 is offered only in fall and LING 4302 and 4305 are offered only in the Spring.

2. LING 4316 is offered every fall and LING 3315 is offered in the spring. Other electives may vary in the frequency and semester in which they are offered.
