Notes about major requirements:

- Majors must complete a minimum of 6 advanced hours in United States history, a minimum of 6 advanced hours in European history, and a minimum of 6 advanced hours in a non-U.S./non-European field.
- Majors must complete a minimum of 9 hours of 4000-level history courses.
- Students completing World Cultures I, II, III and IV in the Baylor Interdisciplinary Core receive credit toward the major for HIS 1305 and 1307. A petition is required. This credit can only be applied to one discipline.
- Recommended electives in other fields include courses from anthropology, English, foreign language, philosophy, political science and sociology.
- A grade of "C" or better must be earned in HIS courses used for the major.
- Check your degree audit often through Bearweb to ensure that you are making timely progress toward your degree.
