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Profile of Undergraduate Transfers Fall 2016 and Fall 2017

Fall 2017

The largest group of the 366 transfers entered Baylor as sophomores (54.6%). Fifty-seven percent of the transfer students are females. Forty-nine percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 21 percent of the group, 27 percent are Christian with no affiliation, and 15 percent are Catholic.

Eighty-eight percent of these students are United States citizens, while 44 (12%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 7 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' home addresses, the undergraduate transfer class is comprised of students from 31 states. Texas is the home address state for 66 percent of the students.

Fall 2016

The largest group of the 430 transfers entered Baylor as sophomores (50.5%). Fifty-seven percent of the transfer students are females. Fifty-four percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 21 percent of the group, 22 percent are Christian with no affiliation, and 16 percent are Catholic.

Eighty-four percent of these students are United States citizens, while 68 (15.8%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 12 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' home addresses, the undergraduate transfer class is comprised of students from 27 states. Texas is the home address state for 63 percent of the students.

^{*} In this report, two race/ethnic group tables are presented. When providing information on their race and ethnicity, students were asked two questions. The first question asked the student: Are you Hispanic/Latino? The second question allowed students to select among five race categories, with multiple responses allowed. In the first table, students are counted in only one race/ethnic group category. If the student indicated "yes" to the first question, the student was categorized as Hispanic (only) regardless of any race code(s) they may have selected. If the student marked more than one race (and "no" to Hispanic/Latino in the first question), he/she was reported in the category of Multiracial. The second table counts a student in every race/ethnic group category he/she selected. The percentages in this table are based on the headcount of students.
