# **APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION**

The Graduate School is pleased that you are interested in pursuing graduate studies at Baylor University. Please read and follow the instructions below so that the Graduate School can accurately process your application materials. Note that the responsibility of securing and submitting the application materials, transcripts, test scores, and other necessary information rests upon the applicant. A reference index is provided at the back of this application booklet; when a specific entry is requested, refer to the index for the appropriate code. Please be accurate and complete in recording entries, since they may affect your classification, program, advisement, or registration.

## **APPLICATION PROCEDURE**

As you begin the application process, please contact the director of the graduate program to which you are applying. This contact will identify all of the components (e.g., test scores, supplemental forms, essays, etc.) necessary for a completed application for that program. More importantly, this interaction enables you to determine if that program will suit your academic goals. Refer to the insert for program phone numbers and email addresses.

### ELIGIBILITY

You are required to have a bachelor's degree from an accredited institution in the United States, or proof of equivalent training at a foreign university. Ultimate approval for admission to graduate study is given by the Dean of the Graduate School after consideration of a recommendation from the department, school, academy, or institute to which you have applied.

A completed application consists of the following:

### **1. APPLICATION FOR GRADUATE ADMISSION**

This 2-page form serves for all graduate programs in the Baylor Graduate School and is for domestic and international applicants. Be sure to provide your email address so that we can correspond with you regarding the status of your application.

# 2. TRANSCRIPTS

Arrange for <u>official</u> transcripts from all undergraduate and graduate institutions attended to be sent to the Baylor University Graduate School. (Records for former and current Baylor University students are already on file in the Records Office; the Graduate School will obtain those transcripts from Records.)

### 3. TEST SCORES

Standardized test scores are one of many measures used in admissions decisions. Baylor University Graduate School follows recommendations of the Educational Testing Service (ETS) in use of these scores.

Request that <u>official</u> scores for the Graduate Record Exam (GRE) General Test, or Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT), and/or other standardized measures (e.g., GRE Subject Tests, Writing Assessment) required by your program be sent to the Baylor University Graduate School (ETS code 6032). Consult the curriculum section of the *Graduate Catalog*, or the department to which you are applying, to determine which tests are required.

For all programs, <u>international applicants</u> must submit official scores for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). Note that if the applicant has a degree conferred by a U.S.-accredited institution of higher learning, the TOEFL is <u>not</u> required. Information about this test, as well as details regarding testing dates and cost, are available from the U.S. Embassy or the Consulate of the applicant's country, or by contacting the Educational Testing Service, Box 6004, Princeton, NJ 08541-6004 USA (website: http://www.ets.org/).

Note that if a GRE, GMAT, TOEFL, or other test score is cancelled, then your admission to the Baylor University Graduate School also will be cancelled.

## 4. RECOMMENDATIONS

Professional recommendations are needed from individuals who can address your intellectual competence and potential for success in graduate studies (i.e., from professors, employers, etc.). Recommenders may submit these <u>directly to the Baylor University Graduate</u> <u>School</u> or may provide these confidentially to the applicant who then submits them with the application packet.

<u>Two</u> recommendations are required for programs in Hankamer School of Business; these must be written on the recommendation forms available from the business school (website: http://gradbusiness.baylor.edu/), although letters may accompany the forms.

All other programs require <u>three</u> letters of recommendation. Ask that these letters be written on institutional or business letterhead.

### 5. APPLICATION FEE

A non-refundable application fee is required. The fee for all programs in the Hankamer School of Business is \$50. For all other graduate programs, the fee is \$40. Applications will not be processed without this fee. The application fee will not be waived.

### 6. ADDITIONAL APPLICATION MATERIALS

Several programs require supplemental forms and materials beyond those materials noted on the application form. These include:

The forms marked by an asterisk are available electronically on the Graduate School website. Paper copies of all forms are available from the Graduate School.

Confer directly with the graduate program to which you are applying to be certain that you have all materials necessary for a complete application.

### 7. INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Two additional forms are required of international applicants who are accepted for graduate study at Baylor University. The "Visa Authorization Form" and the "Confirmation of Financial Resources Form" will be included with the letter of acceptance sent to you by the Graduate School. These forms also are available on the Graduate School website.

Please return these two completed forms immediately upon notification of your acceptance. Failure to return these forms, or submission of incomplete forms, will delay significantly I-20 issuance. Only after you receive a Form I-20 will you be able to apply for an F-1 (student) visa from a U.S. Embassy or Consulate in your country. When you have been accepted for admission, a deposit of US\$750 will be required immediately, unless you have been advised that you will be receiving a scholarship or an assistantship. This deposit will be applied to your bill when you arrive on campus. Only after receipt of the deposit or notification from your graduate program of a scholarship or an assistantship award will the Graduate School be able to release your documents to the Office of International Programs for evaluation leading to issuance of Form I-20.

### 8. HEALTH FORM

The "Health Form" is required of all accepted students. It may be submitted with your application or separately to Baylor University Health Services (address indicated on form). You will <u>NOT</u> be permitted to register for classes until this has been received and approved by Baylor University Health Services.
