The Baylor in Italy Program offers courses on The Archaeology and Art of Rome (CLA 4v01) and Reading Rome! (LAT 4v01). These courses introduce students to the art, archaeology, history, and mythology of the Roman world.

Students fly to Rome for two weeks of on-site study. Afterwards the trip moves south to the Bay or Naples before returning to Rome. The Hotel Sant' Anna in Rome is just a short walk from St. Peter's Basilica. Our accommodations around the Bay of Naples offer superb views of the Mediterranean Sea.

The sights, sounds, monuments, and places you visit in Italy become your classroom. In this academic program, you study at ancient sites, visit excavations, and see things off-limits to the general public.
