

Alternatives to Baylor University Assigned Community Service Hours

CPR /AED - Certification Course - (2-2.5 hr course)

Upon completion participants are issued a Course Completion Card valid for 2 years.

Course Fee: \$25

Community Service Credit: **Six (6) hours**
Must submit a copy of your course completion certificate to Judicial Affairs office prior to deadline for Assigned Community Service Hours due date to receive credit. Furthermore, there is a short assessment required at the conclusion of each optional course (3 assessment questions will be given to you after you submit your completion certificate to Judicial Affairs).

First Aid Certification Course - (4-4.5 hour course)

Upon completion participants are issued a Course Completion Card valid for 2 years.

Furthermore, there is a short assessment required at the conclusion of each optional course (3 assessment questions will be given to you after you submit your completion certificate to Judicial Affairs).

Question Persuade Refer (QPR) - Certification Course - (1.5-2 hour course)

(Course designed to increase awareness of typical signs and symptoms of suicidal behavior and what to do in response)

Upon completion participants are issued a Course Completion Certificate.

Course Date and Time: **February 20th (5:30pm-7:30pm).**

Community Service Credit: **Five (5) hours**
Must submit a copy of your course completion certificate to Judicial Affairs office prior to deadline for Assigned Community Service Hours due date to receive credit. Furthermore, there is a short assessment required at the conclusion of each optional course (3 assessment questions will be given to you after you submit your completion certificate to Judicial Affairs).

Alternatives to Baylor University Assigned Community Service Hours

(Freshman Only)

Judicial Affairs/Campus Rec. Ropes Course - (7.5 - 8 hours)

This is a 7.5 – 8 hour experiential challenge course program. Students are led through a series of personal and group challenges through the use of games, trust activities, initiatives, low and high elements. Debriefing occurs throughout the course with themes centered on decision making, personal responsibility, character, integrity, consequences and self-awareness.

Registration: Freshman students sign-up in the Judicial Affairs office during their meeting to admit or deny the student charge of misconduct. There is also a consent form that is part of the registration process.

Location: BU Eastland Lakes Facility

Course Fee: \$35 (Student account is automatically billed via the consent form.)

Course Date & Time: Saturday, **April 22, 2017**, 8am-5pm

Community Service Credit: **Eight (8) hours**

Each student completes a survey instrument at the end of the Ropes Course.

Judicial Affairs Support Advisor Program- (2 hours)

The Support Advisor program is very similar to a Mentor program and the purpose is to provide students, who have been seen in the Judicial Affairs office, with an opportunity for follow-up. The Support Advisor program consists of four, thirty minute appointments, for a total of 2 hours.

Registration: Freshman students sign-up in the Judicial Affairs office during their meeting to admit or deny the student charge of misconduct.

Location: Each Support Advisor and student can meet anywhere they wish.

Course Fee: \$0

Course Date & Time: In general, students can choose the Support Advisor program throughout the fall and spring semesters. However, Support Advisor assignments are not made after Spring Break. *The Support Program is not available in the summer months.*

Community Service Credit: **Five (5) hours**

Each Support Advisor sends a written summary to the Judicial Affairs office.
