

Summer 2016 Honor Code Violations Report

During the summer 2016 semester, there were 6 reported violations of the Honor Code. 3 of these cases proceeded to Honor Council hearings. The other 3 cases were handled by faculty. Some cases are still pending.

HONOR COUNCIL CASES:

Alleged Violation: Plagiarized.

Date of Violation: 4/29/2016

Decision: Guilty

Sanction: Received an "F" for the paper.

Alleged Violation: Failed to follow instructions of Instructor in order to obtain an unfair academic advantage and obtained unauthorized information during an exam.

Date of Violation: 5/7/2016

Decision: Guilty

Sanction: Received an "F" for the course.

Alleged Violation: Misrepresented facts to obtain an academic or economic advantage.

Date of Violation: 5/20/2016

Decision: Guilty

Sanction: Received a permanent "F" for the course.

The remaining 3 reported violations from the Summer 2016 semester were resolved between the professor and the student. The results of those cases are as follows:

FACULTY HANDLED CASES:

Alleged Violation: Altered or falsified a university document.

Date of Violation: 4/24/2016

Decision: Guilty

Sanction: Did not be receive the scholarship and was not allowed to mentor in the program.

Alleged Violation: Failed to follow instructions of Instructor in order to obtain an unfair academic advantage.

Date of Violation: 5/07/2016

Decision: Guilty

Sanction: Received a "0" for the final exam.

Alleged Violation: Offered as one's own work the work of another.

Date of Violation: 5/9/2016

Decision: Guilty

Sanction: Received an "F" for the paper and the course.
