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## Profile of Social Work Graduate Students Fall 2009 and Fall 2010

This report contains descriptive information about graduate students enrolled in the School of Social Work in Fall 2009 and Fall 2010. If a student is in a dual career such as MDV/MSW, the student is counted in each program (i.e., program count).

### Fall 2010

The program count of 110 includes 15 males and 95 females. Thirty-seven percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups and 64 percent are affiliated with the Baptist denomination. Thirty-nine students are dual program (Seminary/Social Work) students.

The social work student body is comprised of 96 United States citizens, 4 resident aliens, and 10 nonresident aliens. The foreign students represent 10 foreign countries. Part-time students make up only 4 percent of the student body. The average credit hour load for social work students is 13.7.

In order to fulfill new federal government reporting requirements on race and ethnicity, students were given the opportunity to select multiple race categories. In addition, Pacific Islander was designated as its own category (separate from Asian). The students were asked two questions. The first question asked the student "Are you Hispanic/Latino?" The second question allowed students to select among five race categories, with multiple responses allowed.

In this report, two race/ethnic group tables are presented. In the first table, students are counted in only one race/ethnic group category. If the student indicated "yes" to the first question, the student was categorized as Hispanic (only) regardless of any race code(s) they may have selected. If the student marked more than one race (and "no" to Hispanic/Latino in the first question), he/she was reported in the category of Multiracial. The second table counts a student in every race/ethnic group category he/she selected. The percentages in this table are based on the headcount of students.

**Fall 2009**

The program count of 122 includes 22 males and 100 females. Thirty-two percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups and 57 percent are affiliated with the Baptist denomination. Forty-three students are dual program (Seminary/Social Work) students.

The social work student body is comprised of 110 United States citizens, 5 resident aliens, and 7 nonresident aliens. The foreign students represent 9 foreign countries. Part-time students make up only 6 percent of the student body. The average credit hour load for social work students is 13.6.
