Retention of First-Time Freshmen of Fall 1999: Six-Year Update

This study tracks the enrollment of 2,772 first-time freshmen that entered Baylor University during Summer and Fall 1999. Student data were examined for the period between Fall 1999 and Fall 2005. Summary information about retention and graduation rates is displayed by selected characteristics. Of the 2,772 freshmen, 40 percent were males and 22 percent were students in racial and ethnic minority groups.

As depicted in Table 1, these first-time freshmen had the following enrollment pattern:

After entering the University in Fall 1999, 83 percent continued their enrollment in Fall 2000. In Fall 2001, 76 percent of the original freshmen continued their enrollment, and in Fall 2002, 71 percent remained enrolled.

Within four years after entering Baylor:

1,258 (45.4%) had graduated,

791 (28.5%) left the University (attrition), and

723 (26.1%) remained enrolled.

Within five years after entering Baylor:

1,918 (69.2%) had graduated,

745 (26.9%) left the University (attrition), and

109 (3.9%) remained enrolled.

Within six years after entering Baylor:

1,996 (72.0%) had graduated,

742 (26.8%) left the University (attrition), and

34 (1.2%) remained enrolled.

Table 1 displays the general flow of enrollment for the first-time freshmen that entered Baylor in Summer and Fall 1999. These students are displayed by gender, racial/ethnic group, highest entrance test score*, and high school class quartile. Retention, attrition, and graduation rates are listed for this six-year period. The reader is reminded that the attrition statistics include those students who completely withdrew from school as well as those who elected to enroll at other postsecondary institutions. The table also appropriately accounts for those students who "stopped out" and later returned to reenroll in the University. A graphic summary of this enrollment flow across the entire six years is displayed in Figure 1.

Tables 2 and 3 display enrollment status by each of the following: highest entrance test score interval, high school class quartile, racial/ethnic group, and gender. Demographic data are also presented in the report "Profile of Freshman Class, Fall 1998 and Fall 1999" *IRT Series*, Vol. 99-00, No. 18.

^{*} Some entering freshmen submitted scores for both SAT and ACT entrance tests. For this report, each student's highest SAT score was compared to the student's highest ACT score, and only the better score was retained.

Provisionally Admitted First-Time Freshman Students

Of the 2,772 entering freshmen, there were 244 (8.8%) who were provisionally admitted to the University in what was then called the Freshman Challenge Program (FCP). (This excludes the athletes coded as FCP.) Among these 244 students, 134 were ranked in the top half of their high school graduation classes, 102 were ranked in the bottom half, and 8 did not have a high school class ranking.

As depicted in Table 4, these provisionally admitted students had the following enrollment pattern: After entering the University in Fall 1999, 70 percent continued their enrollment in Fall 2000. In Fall 2001, 66 percent of the provisionally admitted students continued their enrollment. Within three years after entering Baylor (Fall 2002), 2 (0.8%) had graduated, 141 (57.8%) remained enrolled and 101 (41.4%) had left the University (attrition).

Within four years after entering Baylor:

101 (41.4%) left the University (attrition), and

71 (29.1%) remained enrolled.

Within five years after entering Baylor:

127 (52.0%) had graduated,

101 (41.4%) left the University (attrition), and

16 (6.6%) remained enrolled.

Within six years after entering Baylor:

138 (56.6%) had graduated,

101 (41.4%) left the University (attrition), and

5 (2.0%) remained enrolled.

A graphic summary of this enrollment flow across the entire six years is displayed in Figure 2. Additional information about these 244 provisionally admitted freshmen is displayed in Tables 5 and 6. Some of the subgroups are small and, therefore, retention and graduation percentages, as well as means and even medians must be interpreted accordingly. The information in these tables was included for general perusal by the reader, but no statistical analyses were performed. The formats of these tables are similar to those of Tables 2 and 3.

Entrance Test Scores and High School Class Quartile

High school performance and entrance test scores are the most important early predictors of student retention (Astin et al., 1987). Table 7 is a tabulation of the Fall 1999 first-time freshmen by entrance test score and high school class quartile. The top half of Table 7 displays the 1,631 students who had both an SAT score and a high school class quartile ranking. The bottom half of the table shows the 1,027 students who had both an ACT score and a high school class quartile ranking. Table 8 displays the four-year graduation rates for these two groups of students. Table 9 displays the five-year graduation rates and Table 10 displays the six-year graduation rates. For example, of the 264 students who had an SAT score of 1300 or more and were in the first quartile of their high school class (Table 7), 65.5 percent graduated from the University within four years (Table 8); 83.3 percent graduated from the University within five years (Table 9); and 83.7 percent graduated from the University within six years (Table 10).





Specifically, 83.7% of 264 students had an SAT recentered score of 1300+, a first-quartile class ranking and graduated within six years.
- 3. Some entering freshmen submitted scores for both SAT and ACT entrance tests. For this report, each student's highest SAT score was compared to the student's highest ACT score, and only the better score was retained.
