Profile of Undergraduate Students Fall 2004 and Fall 2005

This report contains descriptive information about undergraduate students for Fall 2004 and Fall 2005. Included in this report is information about the following topics:

Fall 2005

The undergraduate enrollment of 11,825 includes 130 students classified as Non-Degree or Postbaccalaureate. There are 3,168 first-time freshmen and 422 new transfer students. Approximately fifty-eight percent (58.5%) of these undergraduates are females, and almost 28 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 41 percent of the group, while 14 percent are Catholics and 11 percent are Non-Denominational.

Ninety-six percent of these students are U.S. citizens, while 447 (3.8%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 74 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, there are undergraduates from 46 states and the District of Columbia. Eighty-two percent of the students are from Texas.

Among students with reported high school class ranking, 66 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of undergraduates is 1090 - 1280 with a mean score of 1185 for the recentered SAT and 22 - 27 with a mean score of 24 for the Enhanced ACT examination.

Fall 2004

The undergraduate enrollment of 11,580 includes 111 students classified as Non-Degree or Postbaccalaureate. There are 2,785 first-time freshmen and 425 new transfer students. Fifty-eight percent of these undergraduates are females, and approximately 26 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 43 percent of the group, while 14 percent are Catholics and 9 percent are Methodists.

Ninety-seven percent of these students are U.S. citizens, while 407 (3.5%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 78 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, there are undergraduates from 46 states and the District of Columbia. Eighty-three percent of the students are from Texas.

Among students with reported high school class ranking, 65 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of undergraduates is 1080 - 1270 with a mean score of 1179 for the recentered SAT and 22 - 27 with a mean score of 24 for the Enhanced ACT examination.
