Profile of Undergraduate Students Fall 2012 and Fall 2013

Fall 2013

The undergraduate enrollment of 13,292 includes 169 students classified as Non-Degree or Post baccalaureate. There are 3,190 first-time freshmen and 487 new transfer students. Fifty-eight percent of these undergraduates are females, and 35 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 32 percent of the group, while 14 percent are Non-Denominational and 16 percent are Catholics.

Ninety-five percent of these students are U.S. citizens, while 622 (5%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 77 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' home addresses, there are undergraduates from 50 states. Seventy-four percent of the students are from Texas.

Among students with reported high school class ranking, 38 percent were in the top 10% of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of undergraduates is 1130 - 1310 with a mean score of 1221 for the SAT and 24 - 29 with a mean score of 26.6 for the ACT examination.

Fall 2012

The undergraduate enrollment of 12,918 includes 188 students classified as Non-Degree or Postbaccalaureate. There are 3,254 first-time freshmen and 451 new transfer students. Fifty-nine percent of these undergraduates are females, and 35 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 33 percent of the group, while 14 percent are Non-Denominational and 16 percent are Catholics.

Ninety-six percent of these students are U.S. citizens, while 575 (4.4%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 73 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' home addresses, there are undergraduates from 50 states and the District of Columbia. Seventy-six percent of the students are from Texas.

Among students with reported high school class ranking, 38 percent were in the top 10% of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of undergraduates is 1120 - 1300 with a mean score of 1216 for the SAT and 24 - 29 with a mean score of 26.5 for the ACT examination.

* In this report, two race/ethnic group tables are presented. When providing information on their race and ethnicity, students were asked two questions. The first question asked the student: Are you Hispanic/Latino? The second question allowed students to select among five race categories, with multiple responses allowed. In the first table, students are counted in only one race/ethnic group category. If the student indicated “yes” to the first question, the student was categorized as Hispanic (only) regardless of any race code(s) they may have selected. If the student marked more than one race (and “no” to Hispanic/Latino in the first question), he/she was reported in the category of Multiracial. The second table counts a student in every race/ethnic group category he/she selected. The percentages in this table are based on the headcount of students.
