## Profile of Undergraduate Students Fall 2002 and Fall 2003

This report contains descriptive information about undergraduate students for Fall 2002 and Fall 2003. Included in this report is information about the following topics:

### Fall 2003

The undergraduate enrollment of 11,712 includes 100 students classified as Non-Degree or Postbaccalaureate. There are 2,678 first-time freshmen and 420 new transfer students. Fifty-eight percent of these undergraduates are females, and approximately 23 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 44 percent of the group, while 13 percent are Catholics and 10 percent are Methodists.

Ninety-six percent of these students are U.S. citizens, while 425 (3.6%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 75 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, there are undergraduates from 49 states and the District of Columbia. Eighty-three percent of the students are from Texas.

Among students with reported high school class ranking, 65 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of undergraduates is 1080 - 1260 with a mean score of 1174 for the recentered SAT and 22 - 27 with a mean score of 24 for the Enhanced ACT examination.

### Fall 2002

The undergraduate enrollment of 11,987 includes 107 students classified as Special or Postbaccalaureate. There are 2,620 first-time freshmen and 437 new transfer students. Fifty-eight percent of these undergraduates are females, and approximately 22 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 44 percent of the group, while 13 percent are Catholics and 10 percent are Methodists.

Ninety-six percent of these students are U.S. citizens, while 465 (3.9%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 76 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, there are undergraduates from 49 states and 51 foreign countries. Eighty-three percent of the students are from Texas.

Among students with reported high school class ranking, 66 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of undergraduates is 1080 - 1260 with a mean score of 1169 for the recentered SAT and 22 - 27 with a mean score of 24 for the Enhanced ACT examination.
