Fall 2014

The largest group of the 454 transfers entered Baylor as sophomores (50.4%). Fifty percent of the transfer students are females. Fifty-one percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 20 percent of the group, 19 percent are Catholic, and 12 percent are Non-Denominational.

Eighty-four percent of these students are United States citizens, while 75 (16.5%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 18 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, the undergraduate transfer class is comprised of students from 29 states. Texas is the permanent address state for 66 percent of the students.

Fall 2013

The largest group of the 487 transfers entered Baylor as sophomores (49.7%). Fifty percent of the transfer students are females. Fifty percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 26 percent of the group, 18 percent are Catholic, and 12 percent are Non-Denominational.

Eighty-five percent of these students are United States citizens, while 71 (14.5%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 15 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, the undergraduate transfer class is comprised of students from 25 states. Texas is the permanent address state for 68 percent of the students.
