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## **Profile of Undergraduate Transfers Fall 2014 and Fall 2015**

This report contains descriptive information about the entering undergraduate transfer students enrolled in Fall 2014 and Fall 2015. In this report, transfers who initially enrolled in Summer 2014 or 2015 and continued in the respective fall term are classified as entering transfers and are included in the population. Included in this report is additional information about the following topics:

### **Fall 2015**

The largest group of the 433 transfers entered Baylor as sophomores (48.0%). Fifty-six percent of the transfer students are females. Fifty-four percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 21 percent of the group, 21 percent are Christian with no affiliation, and 15 percent are Catholic.

Eighty-three percent of these students are United States citizens, while 72 (16.6%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 16 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, the undergraduate transfer class is comprised of students from 28 states. Texas is the permanent address state for 65 percent of the students.

### **Fall 2014**

The largest group of the 454 transfers entered Baylor as sophomores (50.4%). Fifty percent of the transfer students are females. Fifty-one percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 20 percent of the group, 19 percent are Catholic, and 12 percent are Non-Denominational.

Eighty-four percent of these students are United States citizens, while 75 (16.5%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 18 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, the undergraduate transfer class is comprised of students from 29 states. Texas is the permanent address state for 66 percent of the students.

\* In this report, two race/ethnic group tables are presented. When providing information on their race and ethnicity, students were asked two questions. The first question asked the student: Are you Hispanic/Latino? The second question allowed students to select among five race categories, with multiple responses allowed. In the first table, students are counted in only one race/ethnic group category. If the student indicated “yes” to the first question, the student was categorized as Hispanic (only) regardless of any race code(s) they may have selected. If the student marked more than one race (and “no” to Hispanic/Latino in the first question), he/she was reported in the category of Multiracial. The second table counts a student in every race/ethnic group category he/she selected. The percentages in this table are based on the headcount of students.
