Fall 2016

The largest group of the 430 transfers entered Baylor as sophomores (50.5%). Fifty-seven percent of the transfer students are females. Fifty-four percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 21 percent of the group, 22 percent are Christian with no affiliation, and 16 percent are Catholic.

Eighty-four percent of these students are United States citizens, while 68 (15.8%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 12 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' home addresses, the undergraduate transfer class is comprised of students from 27 states. Texas is the home address state for 63 percent of the students.

Fall 2015

The largest group of the 433 transfers entered Baylor as sophomores (48.0%). Fifty-six percent of the transfer students are females. Fifty-four percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 21 percent of the group, 21 percent are Christian with no affiliation, and 15 percent are Catholic.

Eighty-three percent of these students are United States citizens, while 72 (16.6%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 16 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' home addresses, the undergraduate transfer class is comprised of students from 28 states. Texas is the home address state for 65 percent of the students.

The second table counts a student in every race/ethnic group category he/she selected. The percentages in this table are based on the headcount of students.
