Profile of Undergraduate Students Fall 2017 and Fall 2018

Fall 2018

The undergraduate enrollment of 14,188 includes 152 students classified as Non-Degree or Postbaccalaureate. There are 3,366 first-time freshmen and 352 new transfer students. Sixty percent of these undergraduates are females, and 36.5 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 26.2 percent of the group, while 17.1 percent are Catholics and 18.0 percent indicated they are Christian (No Affiliation).

Ninety-five percent of these students are U.S. citizens, while 658 (4.6%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 72 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' home addresses, there are undergraduates from 49 states and the District of Columbia. Sixty-six percent of the students are from Texas.

Among students with a reported high school class ranking, 41 percent were in the top 10% of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of undergraduates is 1200 – 1350 with a mean score of 1278 for the Redesigned SAT and 26 - 31 with a mean score of 28.0 for the ACT examination.

Fall 2017

The undergraduate enrollment of 14,316 includes 132 students classified as Non-Degree or Postbaccalaureate. There are 3,320 first-time freshmen and 366 new transfer students. Fifty-nine percent of these undergraduates are females, and 36.1 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 27.3 percent of the group, while 16.7 percent are Catholics and 15.5 percent indicated they are Christian (No Affiliation).

Ninety-six percent of these students are U.S. citizens, while 644 (4.5%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 73 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' home addresses, there are undergraduates from all 50 states and the District of Columbia. Sixty-eight percent of the students are from Texas.

Among students with a reported high school class ranking, 41 percent were in the top 10% of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of undergraduates is 1200 - 1360 with a mean score of 1280 for the Redesigned SAT and 25 - 30 with a mean score of 27.8 for the ACT examination.

* In this report, two race/ethnic group tables are presented. When providing information on their race and ethnicity, students were asked two questions. The first question asked the student: Are you Hispanic/Latino? The second question allowed students to select among five race categories, with multiple responses allowed. In the first table, students are counted in only one race/ethnic group category. If the student indicated “yes” to the first question, the student was categorized as Hispanic (only) regardless of any race code(s) they may have selected. If the student marked more than one race (and “no” to Hispanic/Latino in the first question), he/she was reported in the category of Multiracial. The second table counts a student in every race/ethnic group category he/she selected. The percentages in this table are based on the headcount of students.
