Fall 2018

The program count of 160 includes 14 males and 146 females. Thirty-six percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups and 44 percent are affiliated with the Baptist denomination. Twenty-seven students are enrolled in dual programs. Specifically, 26 are Seminary/Social Work students while 1 is a Social Work/Graduate School student.

The Social Work student body is comprised of 151 United States citizens, 1 resident alien, and 8 nonresident aliens. The foreign students represent 5 foreign countries. Part-time students make up 8 percent of the student body. The average credit hour load for social work students is 13.3.

Fall 2017

The program count of 163 includes 18 males and 145 females. Thirty-seven percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups and 39 percent are affiliated with the Baptist denomination. Twenty-four students are enrolled in dual programs. Specifically, 22 are Seminary/Social Work students while 2 are Social Work/Graduate School students.

The Social Work student body is comprised of 155 United States citizens, 2 resident aliens, and 6 nonresident aliens. The foreign students represent 4 foreign countries. Part-time students make up 13 percent of the student body. The average credit hour load for social work students is 13.3.

^{*} In this report, two race/ethnic group tables are presented. When providing information on their race and ethnicity, students were asked two questions. The first question asked the student: Are you Hispanic/Latino? The second question allowed students to select among five race categories, with multiple responses allowed. In the first table, students are counted in only one race/ethnic group category. If the student indicated "yes" to the first question, the student was categorized as Hispanic (only) regardless of any race code(s) they may have selected. If the student marked more than one race (and "no" to Hispanic/Latino in the first question), he/she was reported in the category of Multiracial. The second table counts a student in every race/ethnic group category he/she selected. The percentages in this table are based on the headcount of students.
