Fall 2006

The undergraduate enrollment of 11,831 includes 97 students classified as Non-Degree or Postbaccalaureate. There are 2,783 first-year students (first-year students were formerly called first-time freshmen) and 494 new transfer students. Approximately fifty-nine percent (59.4%) of these undergraduates are females, and almost 28 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 41 percent of the group, while 14 percent are Catholics and 13 percent are Non-Denominational.

Ninety-six percent of these students are U.S. citizens, while 449 (3.8%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 63 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, there are undergraduates from 48 states and the District of Columbia. Eighty-two percent of the students are from Texas.

Among students with reported high school class ranking, 67 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of undergraduates is 1100 - 1290 with a mean score of 1195 for the recentered SAT and 22 - 27 with a mean score of 25 for the Enhanced ACT examination.

Fall 2005

The undergraduate enrollment of 11,825 includes 130 students classified as Non-Degree or Postbaccalaureate. There are 3,168 first-year students and 422 new transfer students. Approximately fifty-eight percent (58.5%) of these undergraduates are females, and almost 28 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 41 percent of the group, while 14 percent are Catholics and 11 percent are Non-Denominational.

Ninety-six percent of these students are U.S. citizens, while 447 (3.8%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 74 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, there are undergraduates from 46 states and the District of Columbia. Eighty-two percent of the students are from Texas.

Among students with reported high school class ranking, 66 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of undergraduates is 1090 - 1280 with a mean score of 1185 for the recentered SAT and 22 - 27 with a mean score of 24 for the Enhanced ACT examination.
