Profile of Fall 2020 First-Time Freshman Baylor Line Camp Attendees

Baylor Line Camp is an extended orientation program that helps better equip new students in their transition to Baylor. While Baylor usually offers five different types of camps – Regular, Engineering and Computer Science (ECS), Outdoor Adventure (OA), Honors, and Missions – due to Covid-19 only the Regular camp was offered virtually this summer.
