Fall 2007

The largest group of the 452 transfers entered Baylor as sophomores (49.8%). Fifty-six (56) percent of the transfer students are females. Approximately thirty-three percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 35 percent of the group, approximately 17 percent are Non-Denominational, and 12 percent are Catholic.

Ninety-four percent of these students are United States citizens, while 29 (6.4%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 21 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, the undergraduate transfer class is comprised of students from 29 states. Texas is the permanent address state for 82 percent of the students.

Entrance test score statistics presented here represent only 245 of the 452 undergraduate transfers in 2007.

Fall 2006

The largest group of the 494 transfers entered Baylor as sophomores (53.2%). Slightly more than 56 percent of the transfer students are females. Thirty-four percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 36 percent of the group, approximately 16 percent are Non-Denominational, and 13 percent are Catholic.

Ninety-two percent of these students are United States citizens, while 40 (8.1%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 20 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, the undergraduate transfer class is comprised of students from 24 states. Texas is the permanent address state for 84 percent of the students.

Entrance test score statistics presented here represent only 245 of the 494 undergraduate transfers in 2006.
