Retention and Graduation Rates of Doctoral Students Fall 1991 – Fall 2007

Executive Summary

An analysis of retention and graduation rates for entering doctoral students was performed. Based on fiveyear averages, the following questions were answered:

•	What percentage of first-time doctoral students graduate within <u>four</u> years?	31%
•	What percentage of first-time doctoral students graduate within <u>five</u> years?	51%

• What percentage of first-time doctoral students graduate within <u>six</u> years? 59%

• What percentage of first-time doctoral students graduate within seven years? 63%

Detailed Report

This report contains information on the retention of doctoral students at Baylor University. Doctoral students have a maximum time limit of ten years to complete the doctoral program, and any extension of the time limit must be approved by the Dean of the Graduate School. Even though some students take the full ten years to complete their program, the majority of doctoral students finish within seven years from the time of entry. All doctoral students were considered together as a group, and there was no differentiation between PhD, EdD or PsyD students.

Since the sizes of incoming classes are relatively small, there are issues that must be considered when doing any type of retention study. Semester data is 'frozen' on the official census day of the semester. If a student registers or completes financial registration after the census day, he or she would not be included in the data, and thus would appear as a 'leaver' when actually they continued to be enrolled.

Based on five-year averages, one-half of entering doctoral students graduate within five years. Nearly 60% of entering doctoral students graduate within seven years. Details for each incoming class can be found in the table on the following page.
