Fall 2009

The largest group of the 422 transfers entered Baylor as sophomores (52.4%). Fifty-nine percent of the transfer students are females. Thirty-eight percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 33 percent of the group, 17 percent are Catholic, and 16 percent are Non-Denominational.

Ninety-one percent of these students are United States citizens, while 38 (9%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 19 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, the undergraduate transfer class is comprised of students from 23 states. Texas is the permanent address state for 84 percent of the students.

Entrance test score statistics presented here represent only 251 of the 422 undergraduate transfers in 2009.

Fall 2008

The largest group of the 404 transfers entered Baylor as sophomores (50.2%). Fifty-nine percent of the transfer students are females. Thirty-three percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise 35 percent of the group, 17 percent are Non-Denominational, and 14 percent are Catholic.

Ninety-one percent of these students are United States citizens, while 36 (8.9%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 19 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, the undergraduate transfer class is comprised of students from 28 states. Texas is the permanent address state for 78 percent of the students.

Entrance test score statistics presented here represent only 223 of the 404 undergraduate transfers in 2008.
