**Full-Time Equivalent (FTE)*: The full-time equivalent of Baylor's part-time enrollment is estimated by totaling the number of hours of all part-time students and dividing by the number of hours needed to be a full-time student at that level (12 hours for undergraduates, 9 hours for graduate and seminary students, and 10 hours for law students). The results are then added to the full-time enrollment headcounts to obtain an FTE for all students enrolled.
