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### **Profile of Graduate School Students Fall 2010 and Fall 2011**

This report contains descriptive information about students enrolled in programs in the Graduate School in Fall 2010 and Fall 2011. If a student is in two different programs (BBA/MBA, MBA/MSIS, JD/MTax, MDiv/MM, etc.), the student is counted in each program in the appropriate academic unit (i.e., program count). Military programs are excluded from this report.

#### **Fall 2011**

The program count of 1,482 includes 8 students classified as Graduate Nondegree. There are 520 new graduate students. Fifty-one percent of the graduate enrollment are males, and 25 percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Twenty-seven percent are affiliated with the Baptist denomination.

Eighty-seven percent of these students are United States citizens, while 196 (13%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 44 foreign countries. The score range for the middle fifty percent of graduate students is 1100-1330 with a mean of 1214 for the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) and 570 - 650 with a mean of 610 for the Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT).

#### **Fall 2010**

The program count of 1,481 includes 13 students classified as Graduate Nondegree. There are 496 new graduate students. Fifty percent of the graduate enrollment are males, and 25 percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Twenty-nine percent are affiliated with the Baptist denomination.

Eighty-six percent of these students are United States citizens, while 202 (14%) are resident or nonresident aliens, representing 45 foreign countries. The score range for the middle fifty percent of graduate students is 1090 -1320 with a mean of 1202 for the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) and 570 - 640 with a mean of 603 for the Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT).

\* In order to fulfill new federal government reporting requirements on race and ethnicity, students were given the opportunity to select multiple race categories. In addition, Pacific Islander was designated as its own category (separate from Asian). The students were asked two questions. The first question asked the student "Are you Hispanic/Latino?" The second question allowed students to select among five race categories, with multiple responses allowed.

In this report, two race/ethnic group tables are presented. In the first table, students are counted in only one race/ethnic group category. If the student indicated "yes" to the first question, the student was categorized as Hispanic (only) regardless of any race code(s) they may have selected. If the student marked more than one race (and "no" to Hispanic/Latino in the first question), he/she was reported in the category of Multiracial. The second table counts a student in every race/ethnic group category he/she selected. The percentages in this table are based on the headcount of students.
