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## Profile of Baylor Interdisciplinary Core (BIC) Students, Fall 2011

The Baylor Interdisciplinary Core (BIC) option for the general education degree requirements began in the fall of 1995. The Baylor Bulletin describes the BIC program as an attempt to “. . . integrate various academic disciplines with a set of comprehensive interdisciplinary courses to provide a coherent approach to learning.” This profile contains descriptive information about students in the program for Fall 2011 with comparison information for all undergraduate students. Please note that BIC students are included in the undergraduate totals.

BIC enrollment for the Fall 2011 term consists of 587 students, which is 5% of the total undergraduate population. There are 195 first-time freshmen enrolled in the BIC program (6.4% of the entering class). The percentage of females in the BIC program is higher than the undergraduate population (64.7% compared to 57.9%). Minority participation in the BIC program closely resembles the undergraduate population (37.3% compared to 34.2%).

Among the BIC students with a reported high school class ranking, 82 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of the students in the BIC program is 1220 – 1360 with a mean score of 1292 for the SAT and 27 – 31 with a mean score of 28.9 for the ACT examination. In comparison, the score range for the middle fifty percent of the undergraduate students is 1120 – 1300 with a mean score of 1212 for the SAT and 24 – 29 with a mean score of 26.2 for the ACT examination.

The average credit hour load for BIC students is higher than the undergraduate population in all academic units. Overall, BIC students carry an average load of 15.8 hours while undergraduate students carry an average load of 15.0 hours. A higher percentage of BIC students are Pre-Law (13.8%) or Pre-Med (32.4%) than the undergraduate students (6.1% Pre-Law and 20.5% Pre-Med).

\* In order to fulfill new federal government reporting requirements on race and ethnicity, students were given the opportunity to select multiple race categories. In addition, Pacific Islander was designated as its own category (separate from Asian). The students were asked two questions. The first question asked the student "Are you Hispanic/Latino?" The second question allowed students to select among five race categories, with multiple responses allowed.

In this report, two race/ethnic group tables are presented. In the first table, students are counted in only one race/ethnic group category. If the student indicated "yes" to the first question, the student was categorized as Hispanic (only) regardless of any race code(s) they may have selected. If the student marked more than one race (and "no" to Hispanic/Latino in the first question), he/she was reported in the category of Multiracial. The second table counts a student in every race/ethnic group category he/she selected. The percentages in this table are based on the headcount of students.
