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### **Profile of Freshman Class Fall 2003 and Fall 2004**

This report contains descriptive information about first-time freshmen for Fall 2003 and Fall 2004. Included in this report is information about the following topics:

#### **Fall 2004**

The class of 2,785 first-time freshmen includes those students who entered the University during Summer 2004 and Fall 2004. Approximately 60 percent of the class are females, and 30 percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise approximately 40 percent of the group, while 15 percent are Catholic and 13 percent are Non-Denominational.

Ninety-seven percent of these students are United States citizens, while 84 (3.0%) are resident or nonresident aliens representing 34 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, the freshman class is comprised of students from 42 states. Approximately 81 percent of the freshmen are from Texas.

Among students with high school class ranking, 67 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of the entering freshman class is 1090 – 1280 with a mean score of 1190 for the Recentered SAT and 22 – 27 with a mean score of 25 for the Enhanced ACT examination.

#### **Fall 2003**

The class of 2,678 first-time freshmen includes those students who entered the University during Summer 2003 and Fall 2003. Approximately 63 percent of the class are females, and 26 percent are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Students with a Baptist religious affiliation comprise approximately 46 percent of the group, while 12 percent are Catholic and 9 percent are Methodists.

Approximately ninety-eight percent of these students are United States citizens, while 65 (2.4%) are resident or nonresident aliens representing 21 foreign countries. By domicile, as reflected in the students' permanent addresses, the freshman class is comprised of students from 39 states. Approximately 81 percent of the freshmen are from Texas.

Among students with high school class ranking, 67 percent were in the top quartile of their high school graduating classes. The score range for the middle fifty percent of the entering freshman class is 1085 – 1270 with a mean score of 1179 for the Recentered SAT and 22 – 27 with a mean score of 24 for the Enhanced ACT examination.
