

# Baylor Law.

## First Year Costs At-a-Glance

Tuition is currently \$1,471 /credit hour. The Student Bar Association (SBA) fee is currently \$2.25/credit hour. The optional parking fee is currently \$365/year. The amounts below are based on current rates. Although subject to change, tuition and fee rates are usually set starting every Summer and remain the same from Summer-Spring of each year.

### Spring Starters:

Tuition & Fees Spring (14 credit hours):

- \$20,594 Tuition
- \$31.50 SBA fee
- \$365 Optional parking fee for year
  - **TOTAL: \$20,625.50 (\$20,990.50 with parking)**

Tuition & Fees Summer (15 credit hours):

- \$22,065 Tuition
- \$33.75 SBA fee
  - **TOTAL: \$22,098.75**

Tuition & Fees Fall (12 credit hours):

- \$17,652 Tuition
- \$27 SBA fee
  - **TOTAL: \$17,679**

Note:

- You take 41 credit hours in your first year so will have to take 85 hours over your second and third years to complete the 126 credit hours required for you to graduate.

### Summer Starters:

Tuition & Fees Summer (13 credit hours):

- \$19,123 Tuition
- \$29.25 SBA fee
- Note that parking at the law center is free during the Summer
  - **TOTAL: \$19,152.25**

Tuition & Fees Fall (12 credit hours):

- \$17,652 Tuition
- \$27 SBA fee
- \$365 Optional parking fee for year
  - **TOTAL: \$17,679 (\$18,044 with parking)**

Tuition & Fees Winter (14 credit hours)

- \$20,594 Tuition
- \$31.50 SBA fee
  - **TOTAL: \$20,625.50**

Note:

- You take 39 hours in your first year so will have to take 85 hours over your second and third years to complete the 126 credit hours required for you to graduate.
