

Robert and Elizabeth Barrett Browning

Thursdays, 3-4:30 pm | Sep. 2, 9, 16, 23 Location: Armstrong Browning Library

Explore the Armstrong Browning Library (ABL) on the Baylor campus, home of the world's largest collection of material on Victorian poets Robert Browning and Elizabeth Barrett Browning. View the largest collection of secular stained glass in the world that surrounds this beautiful research center and museum. Interact with the Library's rare books and manuscripts related to Robert and Elizabeth and learn interesting stories about their writing and lives with sessions led by the ABL's librarians and scholars of 19th century literature. This course will be coordinated by **Jennifer Borderud**.

Team Play: The Art of Playing Music Together

Tuesdays, 10:45 am -12:15 pm | Sep. 7, 14, 21, 28 Location: Glennis McCrary Music Building

By popular demand, this course returns with **Wiff Rudd** and **Dr. Kristy Morrell**. Class members will have the opportunity to observe and interact personally with Baylor Music students as they prepare and perform complex chamber music together over a four-week period. Participants will learn the general history of the instruments (woodwind, brass, string, and percussion) and will also be given the opportunity to hold and play various instruments.

Southern Gothic American Short Stories

This course taught by **Diane Hamilton** will explore the characteristics of Southern Gothic fiction. Participants will read one short story per week. William Faulkner, Flannery O'Connor, Eudora Welty, and Truman Capote's works will be examined for their distinctive Southern voices.

The Five Powers That Dominate the Global Arena

Currently, there are five "powers" that have political and economic dominance in our world: China, France, Russia, the United Kingdom, and the United States. The balance of power among them affects nearly every living person by the decisions and actions they take. In the United Nations Security Council, these five entities are the only ones to have permanent seats with veto power. **Dr. David Smith** will draw together the history of the great power system and how these countries moved into their powerful positions and maintain their standing after centuries of circumstances.

You will benefit from the expertise and experiences of Baylor faculty, counselors, and panelists informed by faith, current research, and best practices. The classes, led by **Dr. Dennis Myers**, will concentrate on enriching marital and deep friendships, dealing with the loss of a lifetime relationship, sustaining sibling and adult/child friendships, and thriving as a caregiver.

A Journey into the Prehistory of Central Texas

Wednesdays, 9:00-10:30 am | Sep. 29 & Oct. 6, 13, & 20 Location: Mayborn Museum

Dig deep into Texas history with **Carol Macaulay-Jameson**, an archaeologist who has over 30 years of experience, including field school studies with Baylor undergraduates. Sessions will focus on the Horn Shelter, a Paleoamerican site on the Brazos River, as well as several field school studies in a rock shelter, a 1,000 year-old campsite, and one with rare organic remains. Prepare to be fascinated by findings in the Waco and Gatesville areas as you journey through the prehistory of Central Texas.

The Reformation of the Church in the 16th Century

Tuesdays, 10:00 – 11:30 am | Oct. 5, 12, 19, 26 Location: Mayborn Museum

This course provides an overview of the five major patterns of the sixteenth-century Reformation of Christianity: Martin Luther, the founder of the Protestant Reformation; John Calvin, the second great theologian of the Reformation; the Anabaptists and other radicals who endured extreme persecution; the English Reformation of Henry VIII, Edward VI, Mary, and Elizabeth I; and finally, the Catholic Reformation, which extended Christianity to huge areas of South America. Dr. Bill Pitts, retired Professor Emeritus, Department of Religion, will guide the class through the major events of the Reformation era.

Bob Anne's Book Club: Women of Importance

WWII Operation Overlord: The Longest Day in History

Wednesdays 4:00 – 5:30 pm | Oct. 27 & Nov. 3, 10, 17 Location: Mayborn Museum

Join **Brad Livingstone**, popular historian and Baylor's First Gent, as he goes deep into Operation Overlord, the Allied invasion of Nazi-occupied Normandy France. On June 6, 1944, 1,200 planes, 5,000 naval vessels, and 160,000 troops approached the shores of Normandy. The Allied forces carried out one of history's largest amphibious military operations to take control of Western Europe and bring defeat to the German war machine. Study the planning that preceded it and the ongoing effort that followed it.

Introducing the Enneagram: Nine Paths Back to God

Thursdays, 2:00 - 3:30 pm | Oct. 21, 28 & Nov. 4, 11 Online via ZOOM

This course introduces the Enneagram as a tool to help us understand nine personality approaches and how they shape our relationship to God and each other. You will learn from **Dr. Jon Singletary** about the Enneagram as an ancient symbol and develop a deeper understanding of how God is at work within you.
