⁵ May be in a discipline other than mathematics if the course is judged as equivalent to STA 1380 at Baylor.

⁶ Must be course equivalent to HIS 1300, 1305, 1307, 2356 or 2366. Note: HIS 1300 is preferred.

⁷ Course must cover entire life span.

⁸ BIO Requirements are the BIO 2401, BIO 2402, and BIO 1302/1102 courses. These will be assigned by your advisor to ensure all students are able to complete the sequence in a timely fashion. If students do not register as assigned, they may be dropped from the courses and placed into the assigned course that may not be the original class day or time.
