Position Summary	<p>The University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point Department of Sociology and Social Work invites applications for two full-time tenure-track positions in an undergraduate social work program with full accreditation through the Council on Social Work Education. These are nine-month positions with the possibility of additional summer teaching opportunities. Assistant professors will teach undergraduate courses in areas such as introduction to social work, social work ethics, social work practice with diverse populations, social work methods, and/or human behavior and the social environment, as well as other foundational social work courses as needs arise and expertise permits. The Department of Sociology and Social Work is seeking individuals with a strong commitment to, and demonstrated excellence with, teaching and serving diverse populations, undergraduate teaching, and the ability to utilize practice expertise in the classroom. Experience with distance education teaching and technology is also preferred. The University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point is comprised of three campuses, with the main campus being in Stevens Point and branch campuses in Wausau and Marshfield. Teaching assignments are typically 12 credits per semester and may be split between the Stevens Point campus and the Wausau campus. Responsibilities also include advising, scholarship, and university service. Applicants should indicate in their materials for which start date they would like to be considered.</p>
